The Toronto Children's Chorus (TCC) is committed to providing life-enhancing experiences for children through the study and performance of the choral art.

The TCC will maintain its position as one of the finest treble choirs in the world and will provide unique musical and educational opportunities for choristers at every age and level.

The Chorus will perform the finest repertoire and champion the work of Canadian composers through new commissions and world premieres. The TCC will further develop and support these works by recording, performing and disseminating them throughout Canada and the world.

Job Title: Associate Conductor, Toronto Children's Chorus

The Toronto Children's Chorus is entering its 35th season this year, its fifth under conductor and Artistic Director Elise Bradley. The Chorus has four training choirs leading up to our well known Main Choir. The training choirs rehearse weekly, while the choristers in main choir rehearse twice a week and are separated into two smaller groups to enhance their learning experience. The children range in age from 6 to 16 years.

The TCC has two Associate Conductors working with the Artistic Director choosing repertoire, auditioning choristers, placing current choristers, and generally developing both our vocal and theory programs. Each of the three conductors has at least one choir each to conduct and manage, with the support of an administrative staff and volunteers.

Knowledge and Skills:

Extensive experience in choral conducting, teaching and vocal pedagogy is required.

Application Procedure:

- A curriculum vitae or resume, including repertoire list of major works conducted and prepared is requested.
- Include a letter with a philosophy statement addressing your vision, particular choral interests and goals.
- Include a list of three references that can support the application.
- Candidates are encouraged to submit additional materials that would support their application including: published articles or compositions, sample concert programs, DVDs of performances or rehearsals, and any other evidence of scholarly or artistic work.
